COMMUNITY VS. SEPARATE PROPERTY

Texas is a community property state, meaning that if a couple divorces, all community property must be divided in a manner that is "just and right," or equitable. Community property includes all property, and debts, that the couple acquired during the marriage. A business or professional practice has to be considered in the valuation and division of community property if the business or practice was developed during the marriage.

Separate property, on the other hand, is property that a spouse brought into the marriage. A company formed before the marriage or founded with separate property funds is a separate property business.

However, it will have community property components that will need to be valued and accounted for, such as the following:

- ☑ Joint funds used to expand or invest in the business
- Any appreciation in value attributed to joint financial contributions
- ☑ Each spouse's contribution to the business

BUSINESS VALUATION

A business must be valuated during a divorce involving the equitable division of community property. Valuation makes it easier for the business owner spouse to keep the business running after the divorce and gives the non-owner adequate financial resources as he or she moves forward. This can be time-consuming, as the appraiser must determine goodwill, or the value that most businesses have based on their established name or reputation. Business owners will usually hire professional business appraisers to accomplish this.

BUSINESS OWNERS AND BUSINESS ASSETS IN A TEXAS DIVORCE

CLOSELY HELD BUSINESS

Closely held business entities can be in the form of:

- ☑ a 'C' corporation
- ☑ 'S' corporation
- ☑ limited liability company (LLC)
- ☑ limited partnership, sole proprietorship or
- $\mathbf{\underline{i}}$ any other recognized type of entity.

An attorney with experience in business law and business litigation will need to asses whether all or part of the business is community property.

BUSINESS INTEREST

If the business interest is community property, the lawyer must consult with experts in other fields to value it.

After the business is valued by an expert or a value is agreed upon by the parties to the divorce, the attorney will advise the client of his or her legal rights and develop a strategy to facilitate an agreed division or, if necessary, present the case in the most favorable light to the court.

BUSINESS ASSETS

A critical skill your attorney should possess is the ability to properly document the division of the business assets, ownership rights, and ownership duties when the divorce is finalized.

This documentation must be included in the mediated settlement agreement, final divorce decree, and in the internal resolutions, minutes, ownership certificates, shares, and relevant agreements of the business entity.

If not properly documented, the division of the business will not be completed and conflict between ex-spouses or with the other persons involved in the business is likely to occur in the future.

SEPARATE PROPERTY VS. COMMUNITY PROPERTY

There are three types of marital property - separate property of the wife, community property, and separate property of the husband. All marital assets can be characterized as one of these types, or a combination of them. In Texas, the court will presume that all property the spouses own iscommunity property. It is up to the spouse claiming property as his or her separate property to overcome the presumption by proving very clearly to the court the separate property character. The benefit of an asset being characterized as your separate property is that the judge cannot award it to your spouse.

Characterizing all of your marital property as either separate property or community property is vital to fairly dividing your assets during a divorce. Consulting an experienced and knowledgeable attorney is the only way to ensure your assets are properly characterized before they are divided or confirmed by the court as separate property.
